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


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LADIES AND GENTLEMAN



ver the last few years, we have become a leader in revitalisation in Poland. Dozens of renovated tenement houses, streets, squares and newly-created alleys will make up the city centre of Łódź. Our goal is to make the revitalisation area a vibrant place, bustling with life, full of open-minded people, mindful of the needs of others in their neighbourhood and caring for space around. This is why we are dedicating a series of social activities to the residents of this area. We assist them in seeking employment, promote local initiativesand create friendly spaces for common activities.

We are especially proud of being able to change the quality of life of Łódź residents, which began with the revitalisation of the city centre. The key role in this process was played by the so called Area Hosts and Social Lighthouse Keepers, who not only serve as mediators between the residents and local institutions and assist in relocations, but also motivate people to take action themselves.

The scale of the introduced changes, as well as the focus we put on people and our receptiveness to their needs were noticed in Europe and awarded with the URBACT Good Practice label. Owing to this, we could share our solutions with other European cities by creating an URBACT Transfer Network.

We invited six outstanding cities to participate in the URBAN-REGENERATION-MIX project: Baena, Birmingham, Metropolitan City of Bologna, Braga, Toulouse Metropole and Zagreb. In the course of this project, we shared experiences in the fields of social participation and introducing mediation as a tool for increasing the residents' engagement in the revitalisation process.

Dear Reader, the comic book you have in your hands showcases solutions we have developed in Łódź, focusing on the role and competences of the city mediators. We present different ways of cooperation with residents by adapting activities to various stages of revitalisation projects. We hope you find our story inspiring and encourage you to engage local residents in revitalisation activities and weave a collaborative city..

INTRODUCTION

On the day Łódź was awarded the URBACT Good Practice title, we embarked on an extraordinary journey to teach, share and inspire. Together with our partners, with whom we create the URBAN-REGENERATION-MIX Good Practice Exchange Network, we were looking for solutions which will help us increase the involvement of residents in revitalisation activities and build active local communities in the revitalisation area, ready to act for the benefit their neighbours.

This publication is the Final Learning Log of Łódź, in which we presented solutions developed in the course of the URBAN-REGENERATION-MIX project.

As a Leader we had a unique task. We already had a Good Practice at hand, at the centre of which were Area Hosts and Social Lighthouse Keepers - extraordinary officers (mediators) who support the inhabitants of the revitalisation area in the process of relocation and help them overcome life's difficulties. Our aim was therefore to improve the methods and tools used so as to ensure even broader participation of the residents in the urban renewal process.

On the one hand we acted as experts, on the other hand we drew on the knowledge of our partners and observed the solutions used in their cities, which we then adapted to the needs of our residents. Particularly inspiring for us were the activities carried out by partners from Braga, Toulouse Metropole and Birmingham, which allowed us to take a wider look at the role of mediators in the city.

Braga showed us how to effectively use socio-cultural animation as a method of involving citizens in the city. Toulouse Metropole shared with us knowledge about managing the investment process with the help of an Area Manager who works with all stakeholders in the investment area. Birmingham, on the other hand, encouraged us to work with a local leader who, as a link to the local community, motivates and inspires small groups of inhabitants to act from the bottom up and, through integration activities, builds in them a sense of community and responsibility for the space and the neighbours with whom they share it.

The experience of our partners has helped us to determine the directions for the development of urban mediation and to adapt the roles of mediators to the needs of city areas at different stages of the revitalisation process. In this way, a vision of three paths of mediators' activities was developed. Their competences, scope of activities and working methods are presented on the following pages.



THE MEDIATOR - WITEK

Revitalization Stage: Degraded area/beginning of the revitalization process/ongoing revitalization process. **Role:** The Mediator (combining the skills of a Social Lighthouse Keeper "Supports residents in the life change that accompanies the revitalisation process" and an Area Host "Connects residents with institutions and supports them in the relocation process").


Goal: Supporting the residents of Łódź in the process of change and problem solving solutions finding.

- Initiating cooperation with the residents, stepping out of the office,
- Assisting residents in the relocation process support in handling formalities, finding accommodation, helping with moving to a flat to the new place of residence, monitoring residents situation in the new location.
 - Social work with residents - motivating to make changes in life, ie. encouraging to take up job training, couseling, seeking employment,
 - Establishing new paths of cooperation with city's institutions and City of Łódź Office departments with the purpose of improving the residents' situation and accelerating the settlement of their cases,


- Preparing the residents for the upcoming changes due to the revitalization process,
 - Psychological and social support in the process of change
 finding solutions to day-to-day problems,
 - Organization of support network for the residents in need (establishing cooperation with the Municipal Social Welfare Centre, engaging residents in the activation projects, NGOled social projects),
 - Informing about current progress in the revitalization process





























LOCAL COMMUNITY ORGANIZER - ZUZA

Revitalization Stage: During the revitalization (investment) process and after its conclusion, during new local community building process.

Role: Local Community Organizer: a leader figure, able to bring together people ready to act for the common good of the local residents, animating and engaging the local community. **Goals:** Igniting a will to act in people, integrating the community and invigorating the area in the social and participation aspect.

• Working with the remaining community in the area (residents of the city-owned tenement houses pre-renovation, residents of the private and housing cooperative's buildings, before, during and after relocation process)

Managing a group involving local NGOs, cultural institutions, schools, universities, community centres, businesses and religious organizations and cooperating with them in terms of taking action for the benefit of the residents

- Researching local leaders and residential activists and engaging them in networking
- Overseeing initiatives undertaken by the local community
 - Assisting the residents in applications for funding of projects aimed at local communities or transforming the neighbourhood space




 Supporting the beneficiaries of new social functions (residents of protected apartments, day care centres, children from orphanages etc.)



















THE AREA HOST - DAREK

Revitalization Stage: Finished investment process, finalization of the social revitalization process, local community integrated within the revitalization area.

Role: The Area Host – representing the area in the City of Lodz Office, viewing the area as a whole, assisting every resident of the area (local residents, organizations, institutions, businesses, investors). **Goal:** Continuous development of the area, assisting stakeholders in their initiatives.
